## **SBA's Deadline for Physical Damage Disaster Loans in Maryland for Private Non-Profit Organizations is July 6**

**ATLANTA** – The U.S. Small Business Administration reminds eligible Private Non-Profit Organizations (PNPs) of the **July 6** deadline to submit disaster loan applications for damages caused by severe winter storms and snowstorms that occurred on February 5-11, 2010.

Private Non-Profit Organizations (PNPs) located in the following cities and counties are eligible to apply for both Physical and Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the SBA: Allegany, Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Baltimore City, Calvert, Caroline, Carroll, Cecil, Charles, Dorchester, Frederick, Garrett, Harford, Howard, Kent, Montgomery, Prince George's, Queen Anne's, Saint Marys, Talbot, Washington, and Wicomico in Maryland. Eligible PNPs are those that provide non-critical services such as: food kitchens, homeless shelters, museums, libraries, community centers, schools and colleges.

PNPs may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory and other business assets. The SBA may increase a loan up to 20 percent of the total amount of disaster damage to real estate and/or leasehold improvements, as verified by SBA, to make improvements that lessen the risk of property damage by future disasters of the same kind.

The SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans to help meet working capital needs, such as ongoing operating expenses for PNP organizations of all sizes. Economic Injury Disaster Loan assistance is available regardless of whether the business suffered any physical property damage.

Interest rates are as low as 3 percent with terms up to 30 years. Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based on each applicant's financial condition.

The filing deadline to return applications for physical property damage is **July 6, 2010**. The deadline to return economic injury applications is **February 7, 2011**.
