### **Deadline to Apply for SBA Economic Injury Loans for the August, 2009 Disaster is July 26**

**ATLANTA** - The U.S. Small Business Administration is reminding disaster victims that **July 26** is the filing deadline for federal economic injury disaster loans available in **Carroll and Coos counties** in New Hampshire. The SBA declared a disaster because of damages and losses to crops caused by excessive rain, flooding and a tornado that occurred on August 21, 2009.

“These counties are eligible because they are contiguous to one or more primary counties in Maine. The SBA recognizes that disasters do not usually stop at county or state lines. For that reason, counties adjacent to primary counties named in the declaration are included,” said Frank Skaggs, director of SBA’s Field Operations Center East in Atlanta.

“When the Secretary of Agriculture issues a disaster declaration to help farmers recover from damages and losses to crops, the Small Business Administration issues a declaration to eligible entities affected by the same disaster,” said Skaggs.

Under this declaration, the SBA’s Economic Injury Disaster Loan program is available to farm-related and nonfarm-related small business concerns, small agricultural cooperatives and most private, non-profit organizations of all sizes that suffered financial losses as a direct result of this disaster. Farmers and ranchers are not eligible to apply to SBA.

Eligible small businesses and non-profit organizations may qualify for loans up to \$2 million. These loans are available at a 4 percent interest rate with loan terms up to 30 years. The SBA determines eligibility based on the size of the applicant, type of activity and its financial resources. Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based on each applicant’s financial condition. Under this disaster declaration, the SBA cannot provide loans to agricultural producers.
