Additional Counties Added to SBA Public Assistance Disaster Declaration for Private Non-Profits in New York

ATLANTA – The U.S. Small Business Administration has added **Otsego, Schoharie and Warren counties** as eligible areas for disaster assistance. Private Non-Profit Organizations (PNPs) may apply for disaster damage assistance caused by severe storms and flooding that occurred on March 13-31, 2010 in New York.

The deadline for physical damage was June 15; however, eligible PNPs may apply under the SBA's late filing guidelines, provided they show the reason for the late filing was due to circumstances beyond their control. Examples of eligible non-critical PNP organizations include, but are not limited to, food kitchens, homeless shelters, museums, libraries, community centers, schools and colleges.

PNPs may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory and other business assets. The SBA may increase a loan up to 20 percent of the total amount of disaster damage to real estate and/or leasehold improvements, as verified by the SBA, to make improvements that lessen the risk of property damage by future disaster of the same kind.

The SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans to PNPs of all sizes to help meet working capital needs, such as ongoing operating expenses. Economic Injury Disaster Loan assistance is available regardless of whether the PNP suffered any physical property damage.

Interest rates are as low as 3 percent with terms up to 30 years. The SBA sets loan amounts and terms based on each applicant's financial condition.

The filing deadline to return applications for physical property damage expired **June 15, 2010**. The deadline to return economic injury applications is **January 18, 2011**.
