SBA Economic Injury Application Deadline for Fire in Stroudsburg is September 17

ATLANTA - The U.S. Small Business Administration is reminding businesses in Pennsylvania that Economic Injury Disaster Loans are still available to small businesses and non-profit organizations of all sizes economically impacted by the apartment building fire in Stroudsburg Borough that occurred on December 5, 2009.

“Businesses and non-profit organizations that suffered economic losses as a result of the disaster and want to apply for low-interest loans from the SBA are urged to do so before the **September 17** deadline,” said Frank Skaggs, Director of SBA Field Operations Center East in Atlanta.

Small businesses and non-profit organizations of all sizes in the following areas are eligible to apply: Carbon, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Monroe, Northampton, Pike and Wayne counties in Pennsylvania, Sussex and Warren counties in New Jersey.

Loans are available up to \$2 million for small businesses and non-profit organizations that suffered substantial economic injury from the disaster. These working capital loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills that could have been paid had the disaster not occurred. The loans are not intended to replace lost sales or profits.

The interest rate on these loans is 3 percent for non-profit organizations and 4 percent for businesses, with a maximum term of 30 years. The SBA determines the amount of economic injury and the terms of each loan based on the financial circumstances of each borrower. The SBA determines eligibility for the program based on the size and type of business and its financial resources.

Business disaster loan applications can also be downloaded from www.sba.gov. Completed applications should be mailed to: U.S. Small Business Administration, Processing and Disbursement Center, 14925 Kingsport Road, Fort Worth, TX 76155.

The deadline for economic injury applications is September 17, 2010.
