### **December 29 is Deadline for Economic Injury Disaster Loans for Private Non-Profit Organizations in New Hampshire**

**ATLANTA** – The U.S. Small Business Administration reminds eligible Private Non-Profit Organizations (PNPs) located in New Hampshire that **Dec. 29** is the deadline to submit loan applications. These Economic Injury Disaster Loans are available because of a severe winter storm that occurred from Feb. 23 through March 3, 2010.

The SBA offers these loans to help meet working capital needs, such as ongoing operating expenses for eligible non-critical PNP organizations. Economic Injury Disaster Loan assistance is available regardless of whether the organization suffered any physical property damage. Loan amounts can be up to \$2 million at 3 percent interest rate with terms not exceeding 30 years. The SBA sets loan amounts and terms based on each applicant's financial condition.

The filing deadline to return economic injury applications is **December 29, 2010**.
