SBA to Open Business Recovery Centers in Alabama for Businesses Affected by the Deepwater BP Oil Spill

ATLANTA The U. S. Small Business Administration announced that it will open two Business Recovery Centers in Alabama Tuesday, May 18 to help small businesses and most private non-profit organizations affected by the Deepwater BP Oil Spill that began on April 20, 2010.

“Due to the amount of economic losses caused by the BP Oil Spill in Alabama, we want affected small businesses to have a resource where they can meet individually with SBA representatives and find out how a low-interest disaster loan can help them recover,” said Frank Skaggs, director of SBA’s Disaster Field Operations Center in Atlanta.

Eligible small businesses in Baldwin, Clarke, Escambia, Mobile, Monroe and Washington counties in **Alabama**; Escambia County in **Florida**; and George, Greene and Jackson counties in **Mississippi** may qualify for Economic Injury Disaster Loans up to \$2 million. The SBA offers Economic Injury Loans (EIDLs) to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster.

Interest rate on these loans is 4 percent. Eligibility for an EIDL is determined by the SBA based on the size and type of business and its financial resources. The SBA sets loan amounts and terms based on each applicant’s financial condition.

Business Owners unable to visit one of the Centers may obtain applications and program information by calling the SBA’s Customer Service Center at 800-659-2955 (800-877-8339 for people with speech or hearing disabilities) Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Saturday and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. EDT or by sending an e-mail to disastercustomerservice@sba.gov. Business loan applications can also be downloaded from the SBA website at www.sba.gov/services/disasterassistance. Completed applications should be returned to one of the Centers or mailed to: U.S. Small Business Administration, Processing and Disbursement Center, 14925 Kingsport Road, Fort Worth, TX. 76155. Business Owners may apply for disaster loans on SBA’s secure website at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela/>.

The deadline to return economic injury applications is **February 14, 2011**.
