SBA DISASTER LOAN ASSISTANCE TOPS \$34 MILLION FOR VICTIMS OF THE TORNADOES, SEVERE STORMS AND FLOODING

Sacramento, CA – The U. S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has approved over \$34.1 million in disaster loans to homeowners, renters and businesses damaged by the tornadoes, severe storms and flooding that began May 25, announced Joe Folsom, SBA’s Iowa District Director.

“SBA is the Federal government’s primary source of money for the long-term rebuilding of disaster-damaged private property. SBA helps fund repairs or rebuilding efforts and covers the cost of replacing lost or disaster damaged personal property. These disaster loans cover losses not fully compensated by insurance and do not duplicate benefits of other agencies or organizations,” said Folsom.

“SBA’s disaster assistance employees are committed to helping Iowa residents and business owners rebuild their homes, their businesses and their lives as fast as possible,” Folsom continued. Individuals and business owners who sustained damages are encouraged to register with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) by calling the tele-registration number at (800) 621-3362 or (800) 462-7585 (TTY) for the hearing and speech impaired, prior to the July 28, 2008 deadline. “Don’t miss out on any assistance you may be entitled to by not registering for help,” he said.

Disaster loans up to \$200,000 are available to homeowners to repair or replace their damaged or destroyed primary residence. Homeowners and renters are eligible for up to \$40,000 to repair or replace damaged or destroyed personal property.

Businesses of any size and private non-profit organizations may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory, and other business assets. SBA can also lend additional funds to homeowners and businesses to help with the cost of making improvements that prevent or minimize the same type of disaster damage from occurring in the future.

For small businesses and some private non-profit organizations, SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. EIDL assistance is available regardless of whether the business suffered any property damage.

Hearing impaired individuals may contact SBA at (800) 877-8339. The filing deadline to return applications for property damage is **July 28, 2008**. The EIDL application deadline is **February 27, 2009**.
