SBA to Close Disaster Loan Outreach Centers in Bolivar, Joplin and Kirksville

Sacramento, CA – A. “Dean” Cotton, Acting Regional Administrator of the U.S. Small Business Administration, announced today that SBA will close its Disaster Loan Outreach Centers (DLOCs) in Bolivar, Joplin and Kirksville at 6 pm on Tuesday, August 18.

SBA opened the centers to provide personalized assistance to residents and businesses affected by the severe storms, tornadoes and flooding that occurred May 8 through May 16, 2009. “SBA customer service representatives will continue to be available at the centers to answer questions about SBA’s disaster loan program, explain the application process, help individuals complete their application and close their approved disaster loans. Residents and business owners can speak with SBA representatives on the days and times indicated. No appointment is necessary,” said Cotton.

“So far, SBA has approved over \$1.2 million for Missouri residents and businesses affected by this disaster,” Cotton continued. Individuals and business owners who sustained damages are encouraged to register with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) by calling the tele-registration number at (800) 621-3362 or (800) 462-7585 (TTY) for the hearing and speech impaired, prior to the August 18, 2009 deadline. “Don’t miss out on any assistance you may be entitled to by not registering for help,” he added.

Disaster loans up to \$200,000 are available to homeowners to repair or replace their damaged or destroyed primary residence. Homeowners and renters are eligible for up to \$40,000 to repair or replace damaged or destroyed personal property.

Businesses of any size and private non-profit organizations may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory, and other business assets. SBA can also lend additional funds to help homeowners and business owners with the cost of making improvements that protect, prevent or minimize the same type of disaster damage from occurring in the future.

For small businesses and most private, non-profit organizations of any size, SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. EIDL assistance is available regardless of whether the business suffered any property damage.

Disaster victims may apply online using the SBA's Electronic Loan Application via SBA's secure Web site at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela>.

Hearing impaired individuals may call (800) 877-8339.

The deadline to return applications for property damage is **August 18, 2009**. The EIDL application deadline is **March 17, 2010**.
