## SBA to Close Midwest City and Seminole Disaster Loan Outreach Centers

**Sacramento, CA** – Dorothy Overall, Director of the U. S. Small Business Administration’s (SBA) Oklahoma District Office, today announced the closing of SBA’s Moore and Shawnee Disaster Loan Outreach Centers (DLOC’s). The Moore center, located at 109 East Main Street, and the Shawnee center, located at The Gordon Cooper Technology Center, will close at 6 pm on Friday, July 23.

SBA opened the centers to provide personalized assistance to residents and businesses affected by the severe storms, tornadoes and heavy winds that occurred May 10 through May 13. So far, SBA has personally met with more than 250 individuals and business owners at the centers. “Until the centers close, SBA’s customer service representatives will continue to be available to issue loan applications, answer questions about SBA’s disaster loan program, explain the application process, help each individual complete their application and close their approved disaster loans,” Overall continued. “Low-interest Federal disaster loans are still available to homeowners, renters, businesses of all sizes and private, non-profit organizations whose property was damaged or destroyed by the disaster. So far, SBA has approved more than \$ 4.9 million in low interest disaster loans,” said Overall.

Disaster loans up to \$200,000 are available to homeowners to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate. Homeowners and renters are eligible for up to \$40,000 to repair or replace damaged or destroyed personal property.

Businesses of any size and private, non-profit organizations may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory, and other business assets. SBA can also lend additional funds to homeowners and businesses to help with the cost of making improvements that protect, prevent or minimize the same type of disaster damage from occurring in the future.

For small businesses and most private, non-profit organizations of any size, SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. EIDL assistance is available regardless of whether the business suffered any property damage.

Interest rates can be as low as 2.75 percent for homeowners and renters, 3 percent for private, non-profit organizations, and 4 percent for businesses, with terms up to 30 years. Loan amounts and terms are set by SBA and are based upon each applicant's financial condition.

The filing deadline to return applications for property damage is **July 23, 2010**. The deadline to return economic injury applications is **February 24, 2011**.
